MESSAGE FROM DR LAWRENCE T WONG CHAIRMAN OF THE SIR EDWARD YOUDE MEMORIAL FUND COUNCIL



As the Sir Edward Youde Memorial Fund marks its twentieth anniversary I believe all of us who have had the privilege of working with the Fund, or benefiting from its scholarships and activities, can look back on a fine record of educational achievement for Hong Kong. In that time over 15,700 individuals have received support, enabling people from all walks of life and all levels of the educational ladder to further their studies and contribute to the development of our community.

The Sir Edward Youde Memorial Fund was founded in commemoration of the late governor's passionate advocacy of Hong Kong education. Back in the 1980s Sir Edward was a key driving force behind the expansion of tertiary education, perceiving its vital role in supporting Hong Kong's transition to a knowledge and service based economy. His support was instrumental in the creation of City Polytechnic of Hong Kong (now City University of Hong Kong) and the Hong Kong University of Science and Technology. Indeed his vision extended to the most innovative educational initiatives. For example the establishment of the Jockey Club Ti-I College, with its emphasis on developing the sporting and creative potential of Hong Kong's young people.

It is therefore entirely fitting that the Sir Edward Youde Memorial Fund has, over the years, extended its funding to people with a wide variety of educational needs.

From prizes for secondary school students, to tertiary fellowships and scholarships, to support for the disabled, and awards to adult learners and apprentices, the Fund honours Sir Edward's commitment to an inclusive education for all.

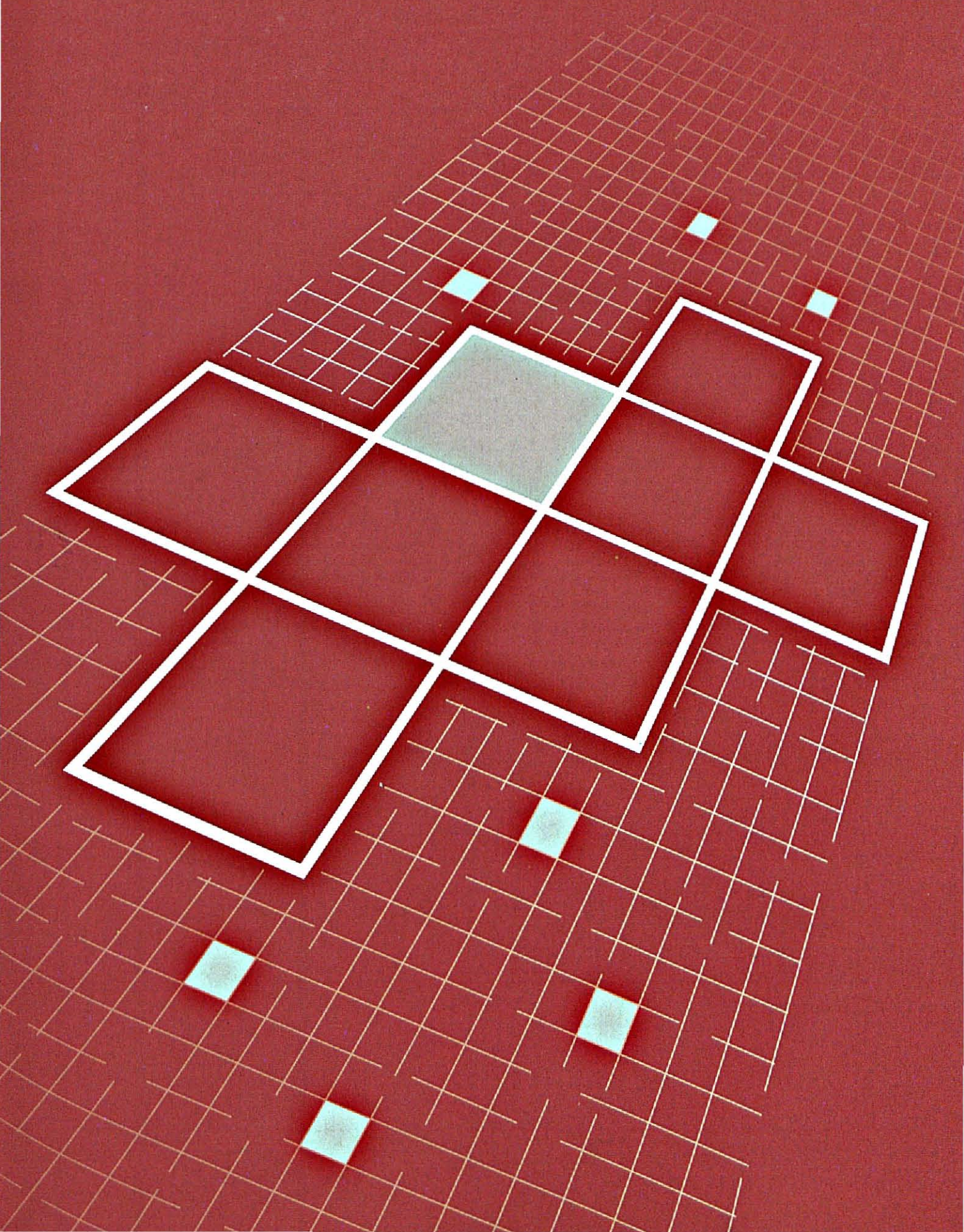

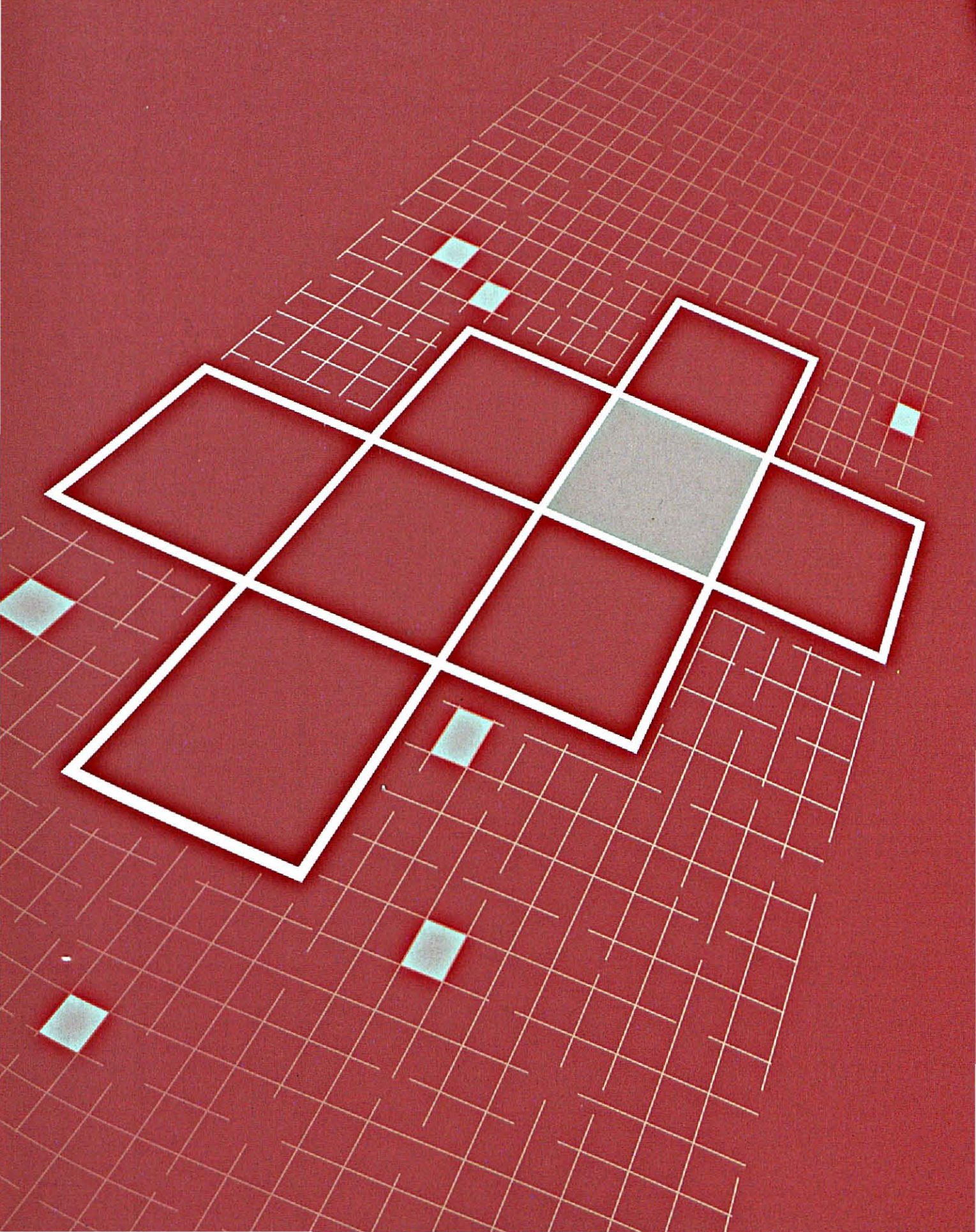

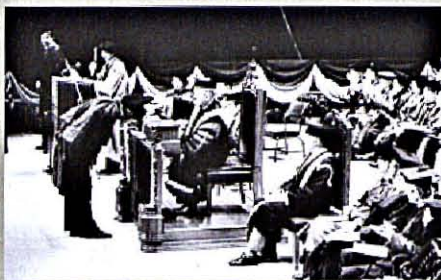

Leaders are always keenly sought after because they prove invaluable, especially at a time of enormous difficulties. Of many qualities, the finest leaders should be visionary and capable of delivering what promised to be visionary. Sir Edward Youde came to Hong Kong in May 1982, which was a time when we were anxious about what to expect for our future. True, he is fondly remembered by the people of Hong Kong because of his extensive and profound involvement in the Sino-British negotiation over the future of Hong Kong. Equally important is his leadership in the development of education, a major constituent in his vision of a better Hong Kong.

Between 1982 and 1986, there were many exciting education-related headlines in the news. The most important ones should include: the formation of the Education Commission, the opening of the City Polytechnic of Hong Kong and the planning of the third university. Any people who knew about Hong Kong politics would surely realize that Sir Edward Youde attached great importance to education as he delegated such important tasks to the able hands of Sir S. Y. CHUNG and Mr. (later Sir) Q. W. LEE, both were members of the Executive Council. It was no secret that Sir Edward met them at a regular interval and he highly regarded their contributions in education.

Sir Edward Youde conceived of a blueprint for education in Hong Kong. In primary and secondary education, he paid more attention to quality than quantity and he was keen to see improvement in language related issues in curriculum. For this reason, he appointed Legislator SZETO Wah to chair the Chinese textbook committee, whose success was the key for the eventual implementation of Chinese curriculum. Another popular episode was his rather unusual high profile in pushing computer curriculum in secondary education, an action he took at the advice given by Legislator Allen LEE. In technical and vocational education, he supported the newly established Vocation Training Council, whose early years up to 1987 underwent great pace of expansion in its programmes. In higher education, Sir Edward saw the urgency to change. He was enthusiastic about the work of the University and Polytechnic Grants Committee. As a result, we can see the growth taking place in many dimensions, specifically 1) expanding the degree programmes at the University of Hong Kong, the Chinese University of Hong Kong, the Hong Kong Polytechnic and the Hong Kong Baptist College; 2) establishing the second polytechnic and the third university; 3) enriching the higher sector by paving the way for self-accrediting and inducing research culture; and 4) mapping the uncharted lands in open education and education in performing arts.

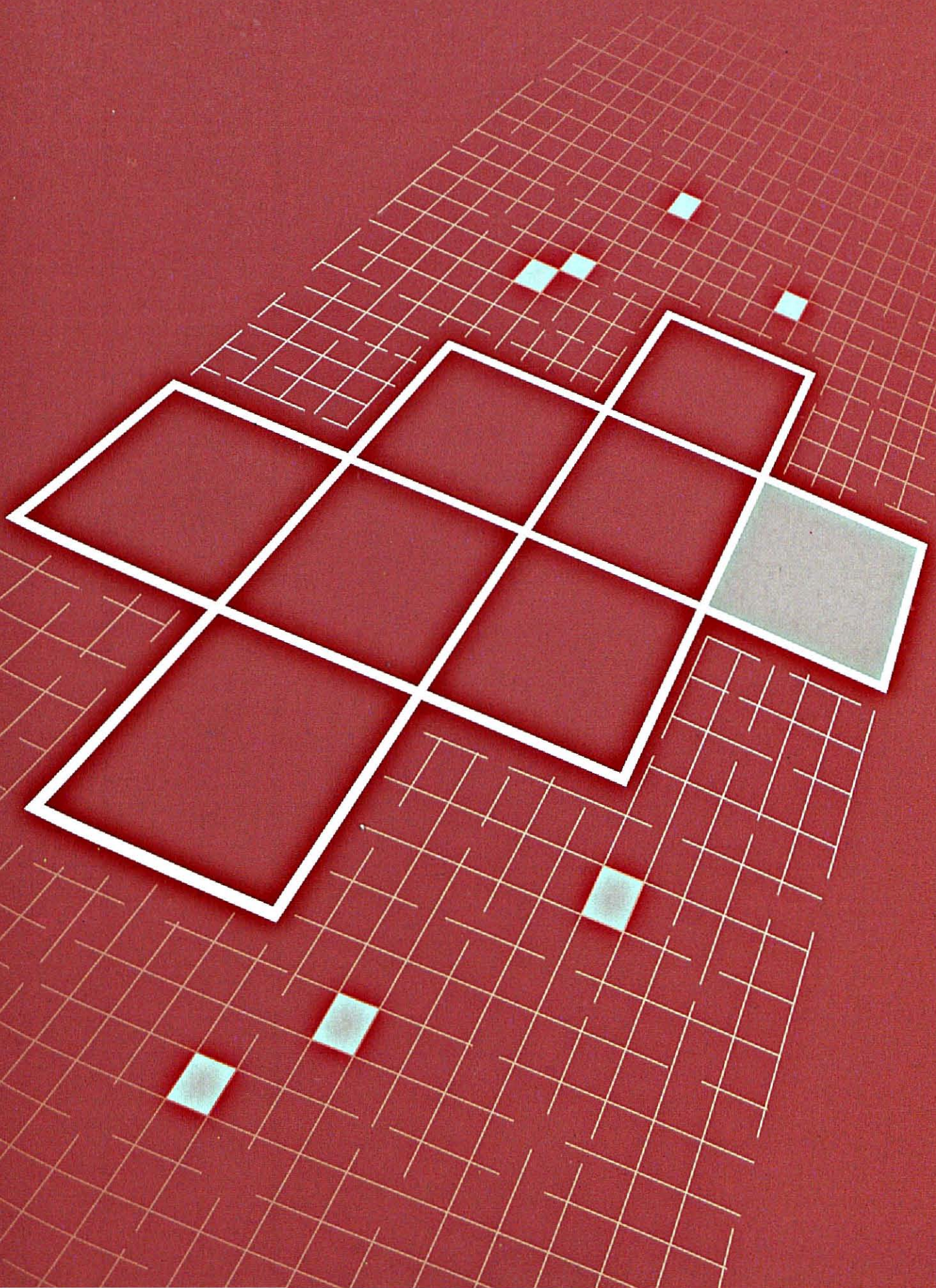
Sir Edward Youde was able to see beyond the daily business routines. He knew that education was a true blessing for the future of Hong Kong. At its own terms, education is self-evidently clear a blessing for every society to survive and to excel. Moreover, his prior positions in China enabled him to understand China very well. He saw that the China - Hong Kong integration would sooner or later become the fact of life for the people of Hong Kong. He was of the conviction that China would have to depend on a Hong Kong whose people have a superior handling of cutting-edge knowledge. It was only in this way that a better future of Hong Kong would be securely fixed.

Sir Edward Youde was an effective leader. He sowed the seeds of change in education and contributed significantly in making a better Hong Kong. His untimely passing in 1986 led, however, to the founding of the Sir Edward Youde Memorial Fund, a device that innovatively carries forward his vision for a better future of Hong Kong. Twenty years have passed. There is now a considerable amount of Youde scholars, of whom some have become mature in their careers. It is in everyone's most sincere wish that they would carry forward with them a spirit of leadership to make Hong Kong a better place!

SIR EDWARD YAUDE MEMORIAL FUND

The Sir Edward Youde Memorial Fund (SEYMF) was founded in 1987 in the memory of the late Governor Sir Edward Youde. The establishment of the Fund and the successful initial fund raising was particularly remarkable under the stewardship of a special committee comprised many leaders of society at the time as well as the wide support from every member of society in Hong Kong. The amount of money donated to the fund indeed reflects the appreciation of the public towards Sir Edward's contribution to Hong Kong and his commitment to Hong Kong's future. Apart from the generous anchor donations from the then Royal Hong Kong Jockey Club (now the Hong Kong Jockey Club), over 70 major companies and associations as well as leading philanthropists, tens of thousands of people in Hong Kong responded to the \$10 donation campaign through 180 community organizations. Approximately 200,000 students from 340 primary and secondary schools donated their pocket money in support of the purpose of the Fund which is to provide for and encourage the education of or research by the people of Hong Kong. Award recipients are expected to contribute significantly to the development of our society upon graduation.

Looking back at what the Fund has achieved in the past two decades, one will be exhilarated to see an increasing number of youngsters benefiting from its various schemes. Growing from an initial fund size of approximately \$76 million in 1987, the Fund's disbursement expanded to a total of approximately \$170 million

in 2005/06 for 182 overseas fellowships/scholarships, 2,085 local fellowships/scholarships, 9 overseas fellowships/scholarships for disabled students, 30 local fellowships/scholarships for disabled students, 308 awards for disabled students, 81 medals for outstanding secondary school performers in Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examination and Hong Kong Advanced Level Examination, 12,757 prizes for senior secondary school students, 30 awards for self-improvement for working adults and 10 outstanding apprentice awards. In addition, it sponsored over 428,750 students benefited under the Fund's Young Friends Scheme of Hong Kong Arts Festival, 12 public lectures organized by various professional bodies sponsored under our Distinguished Lecture Series and 31 public lectures and 3 postgraduate conferences organized by tertiary institutions sponsored under our Visiting Professorship Scheme. In 2006/07 academic year, the Fund had received approximately 1330 applications for its over 930 individual awards under different schemes.

Governed by the Sir Edward Youde Memorial Fund Ordinance, the Fund has been developing steadily under the leadership of the Fund Council and the Board of Trustees, as well as the administrative support by the Student Financial Assistance Agency. ☒



To fulfill the high objectives of the Fund, the Council operates nine award schemes benefiting individual students from senior secondary to postgraduate levels, as well as three sponsorship schemes supporting various activities related to education, professional knowledge and performing arts.

The Fund bestows prestigious awards upon those outstanding individuals in recognition of their academic achievements or personal qualities through its nine award schemes. These include scholarships to finance outstanding Hong Kong students in their pursuit of tertiary education at institutions, both local and abroad; meritorious awards for those outstanding senior secondary students, exemplary apprentices and working adults who have undergone retraining; as well as financial assistance for disabled students in obtaining study aids. Every year, nearly 1,000 students and individuals from different sectors benefit from the wide spectrum of the Sir Edward Youde award schemes.

THE AMBASSADORS OF THE FUND –

Sir Edward Youde Memorial Fellowships and Scholarships for Overseas Studies

In 1987, Lady Youde and the Council shared the vision of developing the SEYMF into one of the most prestigious scholarship funds. Members came to the idea of establishing an overseas scholarship scheme to finance bright young people to pursue higher or post-graduate education in some of the most prestigious institutions overseas.

The Sir Edward Youde Memorial (SEYM) Fellowships and Scholarships for Overseas Studies scheme, introduced in 1988, aims to finance outstanding Hong Kong students for postgraduate or undergraduate studies outside Hong Kong. It is open to students intending to attain their first undergraduate or postgraduate degree at overseas institutions. The Fund will support up to a maximum of three years of study, covering tuition fees, living expenses and some other expenses, subject to satisfactory academic progress.

A very competitive selection procedure has been set up to ensure that only the best local students are qualified as the overseas scholars. Candidates are chosen on the basis of exceptional academic record and their commitment to Hong Kong. They will be assessed based on their character, general conduct and intellect. Each of them has to go through a series of shortlisting and interview boards before being able to win this prestigious scholarship.

HELPING LOCAL DISABLED STUDENTS TO DISCOVER THEIR FULL POTENTIALS –

Sir Edward Youde Memorial Overseas Fellowship / Scholarship for Disabled Students

In early 1990's, members of the Fund noted that resources to assist disabled students to pursue higher education were limited in Hong Kong. They agreed to introduce an overseas scholarship exclusively for disabled students to support the academic pursuit of outstanding candidates, who would act as a good model to others and become a potential leader in the community. The new scheme came into operation in 1994/95.

The objective of the SEYM Overseas Fellowship / Scholarship for Disabled Students is to finance outstanding disabled students who experience either a) total blindness / severe low vision, b) profound / severe hearing impairment; and c) physically handicapped in Hong Kong for postgraduate or undergraduate studies outside Hong Kong.

Eligibility criteria for the scheme are similar to those of the original overseas fellowships and scholarships, except for the additional criteria on disabilities. The successful candidate will be the one who has attained a reasonably high standard of scholastic achievements and has demonstrated the ability to adapt to new environment, be a good example to other disabled persons and a potential leader in the community. The degree of disability and the need to take up education overseas will also be taken into consideration. Each year one award is offered and it is renewable up to a maximum of 3 years subject to certain requirements.

ONE OF THE MOST PRESTIGIOUS AWARDS FOR LOCAL TERTIARY STUDENTS -

*Sir Edward Youde Memorial
Fellowships and Scholarships*

The Local Fellowships and Scholarships scheme was set up when the Fund was established in 1987. The objectives of the scheme are to i) recognize the outstanding academic achievements of local full-time University Grants Committee (UGC)-funded or publicly-funded undergraduate, diploma and certificate students pursuing post-secondary/tertiary education at one of the eight UGC-funded tertiary institutions, the Hong Kong Academy for Performing Arts, the Hong Kong Institute of Vocational Education and the Hong Kong Shue Yan University (formerly known as the Hong Kong Shue Yan College); and ii) encourage and recognize the outstanding academic achievements of full-time students pursuing postgraduate research studies at one of the eight UGC-funded universities.

The scheme is the first scheme introduced by the Council, and has developed into one of the most prestigious fellowship and scholarship award schemes for local students studying in Hong Kong. Starting from a scholarship only for the final year undergraduate/diploma students, the scheme has gradually evolved into one covering promising first year students to PhD candidates over the years.

A DISTINGUISHED AWARD FOR LOCAL DISABLED SCHOLARS -

*Sir Edward Youde Memorial
Fellowships and Scholarships for
Disabled Students*

In 1998/99, the Local Fellowships and Scholarships for Disabled Students was introduced. Its target is to encourage and assist full-time disabled students who experience either i) total blindness / severe low vision, ii) profound / severe hearing impairment; and iii) physically handicapped to pursue postgraduate studies by research and / or undergraduate, diploma and certificate programmes at post-secondary and tertiary levels in Hong Kong.

Same as local scholarships and fellowships recipients, the disabled awardees of this scheme will have to satisfy the same set of eligibility requirements.

AWARDS FOR THE CREAM OF THE CREAM IN PUBLIC EXAMINATIONS -

Sir Edward Youde Memorial Medals

To recognize the achievements of students who attain outstanding results in the Hong Kong Advanced Level Examination and the Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examination, the SEYM Medals scheme was introduced starting from 1988.

Currently, the candidates for the awards are categorized into three streams, namely the Arts Stream, the Science Stream and the Mixed Stream. Selected candidates have to undergo a selection interview to assess their intellectual and personal qualities.

Prior to 1989, only Prizes scheme for students at senior secondary level was awarded based solely on recommendations by individual schools. In 1988, the Council approved a new medal scheme to recognize the outstanding academic achievement of the top students at senior secondary levels, i.e. Form 5, Form 6 and Form 7. Selection is based on the results of the then public examinations, namely the Hong Kong Certificate of Education Examination (HKCEE), the Hong Kong Higher Level Examination (HKHLE) and the Hong Kong Advanced Level Examination (HKALE). In 2001, a "Mixed" stream was introduced as a category of candidates in view of the increasing tendency for students to take a mix of subjects in the two public examinations.

RECOGNIZING WORKING ADULTS WITH GREAT DETERMINATION, PERSEVERANCE AND COMMITMENT -

Sir Edward Youde Memorial Awards for Self-improvement for Working Adults

Since 2000/01, the Self-improvement Awards for Working Adults have been offered annually. This scheme is to foster the spirit of lifelong learning and constant quest for excellence and improvement. Specifically, the award scheme is to give recognition and encouragement to working adults who receive retraining and have successfully integrated themselves into their new job environment.

There are many course providers in Hong Kong that conduct retraining courses to assist workers or the unemployed to take on new or enhanced skills to enable them to adjust to structural changes in the economy. To cover as far as possible the majority of the course providers, two major organizations which represent a broad cross section of the course participants, namely the Employees Retraining Board (ERB) and the Construction Industry Training Authority (CITA), are invited annually to nominate recipients for the award who should have attended retraining full-time before securing their employment.

ENCOURAGEMENT FOR OUR YOUNG CRAFTSMEN AND TECHNICIANS -

Sir Edward Youde Memorial Outstanding Apprentice Awards

The SEYM Outstanding Apprentice Awards, formerly known as the SEYM Best Apprentice Awards, was founded in 2001/02. These awards target to encourage and recognize young people who seek to pursue their development potential by undertaking a course of technical training and a period of apprenticeship in a designated trade. There are two classes of award each year, one at Craft level (Post-secondary 3) and another one at Technician level (Secondary 5).

Other award schemes organized by local organizations also tend to offer awards/scholarships to those students with outstanding academic performance. While most attention has been focused on students with remarkable academic results, there are not so many awards that are available to recognize the unfailing efforts of other groups of people in the society who strive to upgrade themselves. The SEYM Outstanding Apprentice Awards gives due recognition of the efforts of these groups of people.

In 2001, the Council approved that the scheme be established to award the best two apprentices who completed their formal period of apprenticeship under the Apprenticeship Scheme administered by the Director of Apprenticeship and named as "Best Apprentice Awards". In an effort to broaden social recognition of the achievements by outstanding apprentices in Hong Kong, the next best-merited apprentices who had not been selected for similar awards offered by other bodies such as the Vocational Training Council (VTC) have been given the award since 2002/2003.

FINANCIAL SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS TO OVERCOME DISABILITIES -

Sir Edward Youde Memorial Awards for Disabled Students

The SEYM Awards for Disabled Students, established in 1988, is to encourage disabled students with (i) hearing impairment, (ii) visual impairment, and (iii) physical disability in senior secondary 6 and 7, post-secondary and tertiary levels in their studies, motivate them to enter into higher education and enhance the community's awareness of their achievement despite the extra difficulties arising from their disabilities. The award is a one-off grant for the purchase of study or personal aids suitable and necessary for the students' effective learning.

Having considered that the lack of suitable study or personal aids and sufficient supporting services designed for the specific disabilities would cause a lot of learning difficulties to the group of underprivileged young disabled people, this scheme was introduced with a view to providing a source of funds for acquisition of personal study aids and resources. For students pursuing higher education, these resources become even more important but are sometimes very expensive and even not generally available to all who need them. As such, this award scheme is of great value to them and a great encouragement to the disabled community at large.

When the scheme was first introduced, it only covered disabled students nominated by local tertiary institutions. In March 1991, Lady Youde suggested that consideration should be given to extend the scheme to Form 6 and 7 students to give them a better chance to pursue tertiary education. The tertiary institutions and secondary schools make the nominations on the basis of the academic performance and genuine need of the students.

AWARD SCHEME WITH THE HIGHEST NUMBER OF BENEFICIARIES -

Sir Edward Youde Memorial Prizes

The SEYM Prizes for Senior Secondary Students was established in 1987. The aim is to encourage senior secondary students in Hong Kong regardless of race, color and creed to strive for a high standard of learning and to develop leadership abilities by means of awarding prizes to Secondary 5 and Secondary 6 or 7 students or equivalent nominated by government, aided, private, Direct Subsidy Scheme schools and English Schools Foundation schools.

The prizes will be awarded on a school basis. Each school will be given one prize for each of the following categories provided the nominees meet the Council's selection criteria: i) Secondary 5 (Grade 11); and ii) Secondary 6 or 7 (Grade 12 or 13).

Among all the award schemes currently operated by the SEYMF Council, the coverage of beneficiaries of this scheme is the greatest in terms of the number of awardees. The prize scheme does not only symbolize that the SEYMF would cater for the need of every sector of the student population but it also demonstrates the support and recognition given to the senior secondary students from the Council.

*Sir Edward Youde Distinguished
Lecture Series*

The Sir Edward Youde Distinguished Lecture Series, formerly known as SEYM Lecture Series, was introduced with a view to providing funding support to professional organizations and societies to organize lectures on non-academic issues, the deliverables of which are of direct benefit to the people of Hong Kong. Speakers may be nominated by bona fide registered professional bodies / associations. Sponsorship of up to \$100,000 may be provided for each engagement.

PROMOTING PERFORMING ARTS TO STUDENTS -

Young Friends of the Hong Kong Arts Festival Scheme

Launched in 1992 by the Hong Kong Arts Festival Society (HKAFS) with the Music Section of the then Education Department, the Young Friends Scheme aims to increase the secondary school and tertiary students' exposure to and knowledge of performing arts as well as to provide them with an avenue to explore their interests and talents through their participation in activities organized by the HKAFS.

In support of the scheme, the SEYMF has been donating annual sponsorship in an amount of \$400,000. Student members are recruited from secondary schools and tertiary institutions as "Young Friends". To provide the Young Friends with unique arts experience and enhance their appreciation of the performing arts, the scheme provides them with a wide range of activities including on-site presentations and talks, demonstrations, workshops, summer programmes, other activities related to the Festival programmes, meet-the-arts sessions and back stage tours. Each Young Friend is also invited to attend two Festival's programmes free-of-charge.

Throughout the years, the sponsorship for the Young Friends Scheme is considered meaningful, good value for money and worthy of continual support from the Council. Up till 2005/06, the scheme has benefited a total of 444,455 students, of whom 64,993 have been registered as the Members of the Young Friends.

PROMOTING ACADEMIC AND CULTURAL EXCHANGES - *SEYM Visiting Professorship Scheme & Postgraduate Conference for Local Tertiary Institutions*

In recognition of the need to provide more opportunities for education and cultural exchanges between Hong Kong and the global academic community, the SEYMF has since 1995/96 until 2004/05 sponsored eminent members of the overseas academia to conduct lectures locally and to explore the possibility of undertaking research with local tertiary institutions. Amongst the several institutions winning the Visiting Professorship Awards each year, one may be selected to host a Postgraduate Conference at which the Visiting Professor would be the keynote speaker.

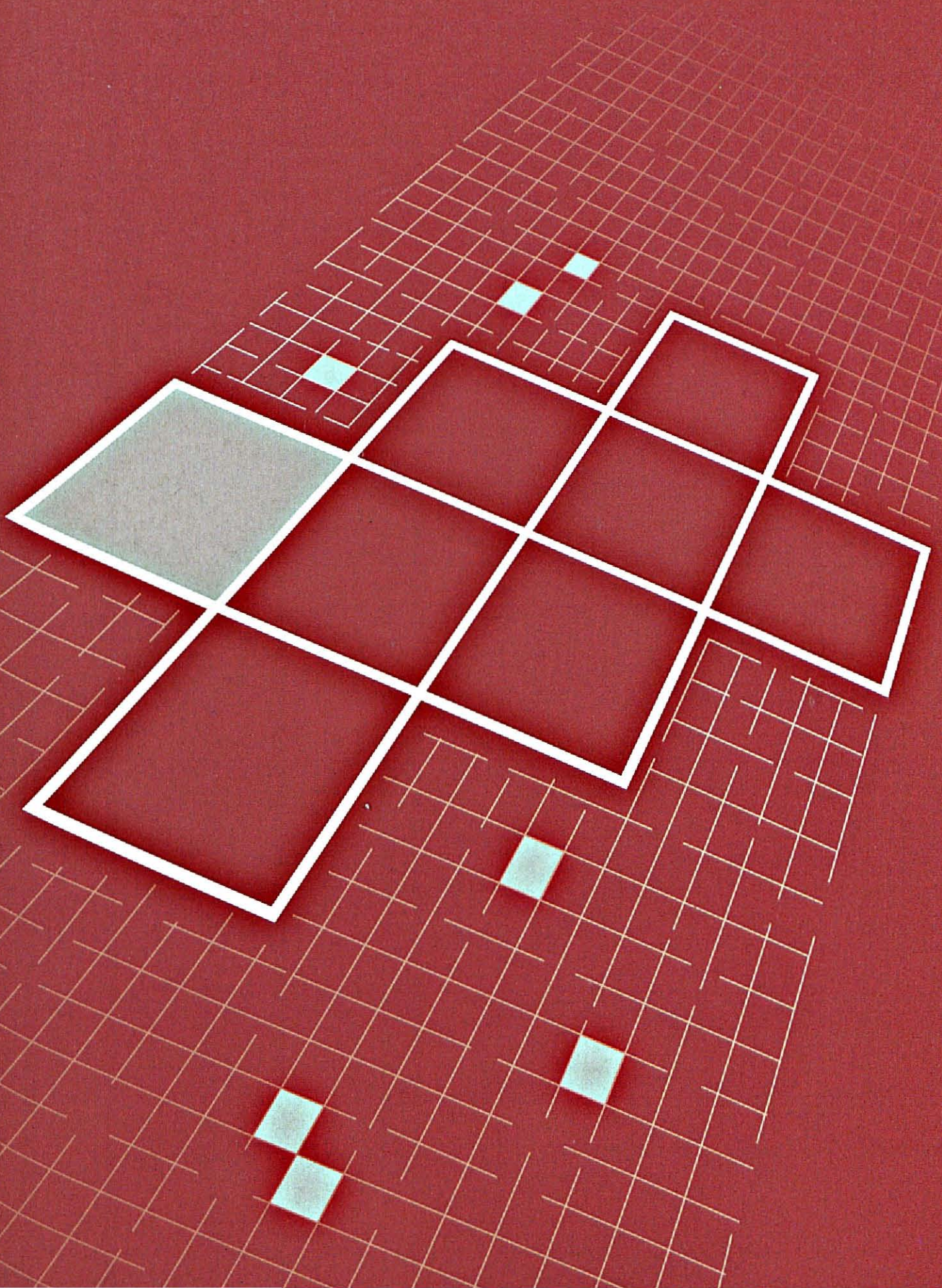
As from the 2000/01 academic year, the Fund sponsored its first Postgraduate Conference to provide a forum for local and non-local postgraduate students to discuss their research findings as well as to exchange views and ideas.

The Fund has so far sponsored 31 visits. As part of their visits to Hong Kong, the visiting professors hold public lectures on selected themes. The sponsored visits are listed as follows:-

Have you ever got tired of bringing so many different chargers on a trip for your cell-phone, ipod, digital camera? Lily CHENG, Overseas Scholar 1997, was studying for her Bachelor Degree in Engineering at the Cambridge University when she felt that there was an unmet need in the market for a new way of keeping mobile devices powered up. She felt that a real usability issue was emerging as mobile devices and applications continue to proliferate in the market and power would become a key limiting factor to the growth of new power hungry mobile applications. Having spotted this opportunity, Lily co-founded a start-up dedicated to developing a revolutionary wireless charging pad for mobile devices. Ever since she graduated, Lily had grown Splashpower Ltd. from 2 to 35 staff members, raised over US\$15million of venture financing and received the first granted patent in this field followed by another 8 additional grants. Splashpower was awarded the Red Herring Award for Top 100 Europe Private Tech Company in 2005 and the product was named as one of the Top 10 Innovations in the Fortune Magazine.

Undoubtedly, Lily was selected as an Overseas Scholar for her creativity and entrepreneurship. What is more, Lily had demonstrated outstanding qualities in leadership, scholarship as well as diversity in her high school years. Being appointed as Senior Counsel (before the handover, the title was known as "Queen's Counsel") in 2003 is a great honor to Paul. Appointments of barristers to the rank of Senior Counsel are made by the Chief Justice in consultation with the Chairman of the Bar Association and the President of the Law Society, in accordance with the provisions of the Legal Practitioners Ordinance.

Paul had embarked on his legal studies by a process of "elimination". Like most male secondary students in the 1980's, he studied science subjects at school and had wanted to read engineering at University level. However, engineering studies required a strong mathematical foundation and since entering Form 6 he began to realize that Mathematics was not his strong suit. He then turned away from engineering and considered alternatives. Legal studies appealed to Paul at that time because it only required (in Paul's mind at that time) (i) an ability to read, write and speak English and (ii) an ability to think logically.

Paul was admitted by the University of Cambridge to study law at undergraduate level. Due to the uncertainties in the early 1980's surrounding the legal system in Hong Kong after the handover, Paul's mind vacillated and at one time he requested his Director of Studies to allow him to switch his undergraduate subject from law to physics. His Director of Studies, however, persuaded him that studying law was not merely for the purpose of equipping a person for legal practice. Legal education could offer a training of one's mind (and method of thinking) that would be of lifelong use, whichever discipline or career one might enter after graduation. Eventually Paul studied law.

The time he applied for the Fellowship was the winter of 1987 (when Paul was studying the Postgraduate Certificate in Laws at the University of Hong Kong, after obtaining his undergraduate degree from Cambridge). The Sir Edward Youde Memorial Fund has just been established then and Hong Kong entered its transitional period leading to the handover. He had an offer from the University of Oxford for a postgraduate degree in law (commencing in 1988). He made an application for, and was delighted to receive the Overseas Fellowships Award. He feels honored to be associated with a Fellowship that is named after someone who worked so hard for Hong Kong during a critical and important period of its history. He is impressed by the versatility of the SEYMF since its awards are not confined to any particular country or subject of studies and potentially a large sector of Hong Kong can benefit from the SEYMF.

In his leisure time, he enjoys reading, films and music. His message to us is that in choosing one's subjects, he should focus on the training of his method of thinking and training of one's ability to analyze issues critically and logically. That is far more important than the "black and white" items of knowledge that one acquires at school.

One must also resist the "conventional" thinking and misconception that to enter into a particular field (say, a "hot" field at the time) one must study a particular "hot" subject at school (for example, the idea that one must study business or accountancy in order to become an investment banker or a corporate whizkid). Likewise one's career path is not necessarily constrained by the subject one studies at University (for example, someone who studies history at school is not bound to become a historian for life, someone who studies mathematics does not necessarily have to become a mathematics professor without any other choices). ☒☒

Viola enjoys her job very much as she has the opportunities to teach youngsters how to build up their confidence, how to tackle problems and how to plan for their future, of which most youngsters are in lack nowadays.

Viola treasured the opportunity of studying abroad as she learned to be independent. She also developed an important skill that is valuable to the rest of her life – “to Voice Out”, i.e. to let people know when you need help as communication should be bi-directional. She was inspired by a Boston classmate who is also visually impaired but works hard to arouse public awareness of people who have special needs instead of only forcing the disabled to adapt to the society.

To Viola, the Overseas Fellowship not only provides financial support for her to study abroad but also boosts her confidence in achieving targets that she never dreams of. Also, she, being a recipient of the SEYM Scholarship/Fellowship, has the obligation to return to work in Hong Kong. She is motivated to work harder as she has the responsibility to contribute to Hong Kong after her graduation. Viola encourages youngsters to set achievable goals for themselves and build up their confidence progressively. Youngsters should try to breakthrough their limits. They also need society's support to build up the sense of achievements in order to do and contribute more. ☒☒

"I don't know how to sing" is a song that won many awards for Edmond; the song is not classified as a Canton Pop song, but its essence of balancing the canton pop music with the classical melody made it popular to the locals, which is also the niche of Edmond's work.

Edmond received SEYM Scholarship in 1999 for a double Degree Course in Music and History, and he further received SEYM Fellowship in 2000 for Master of Philosophy study in Music at the Hong Kong University. His research was about "Chinese Communist applied the music of Beethoven as political propaganda". Meanwhile, he worked freelance in writing advertising music that provided him a good portfolio to start as a composer.

He has never planned to be a composer. It was by chance that his collegemate who works in a record company after graduation invited him to compose a song, "I don't know how to sing", for Hacken LEE, he made a huge success with his first song and entered the industry since then. His other song, "Rolls Royce" sung by Denise HO was also a success afterwards. He decided to postpone his plan in PhD research in music to develop more variety of music in the meantime.

His career path was quite smooth but also rough sometime. He reminds himself that he must not lose confidence sometimes when he did not have idea to compose a song for a few months. He must insist and keep confident on his working philosophy—work on pieces that have eternal and profound value, as following the main trend has only short term value and could be easily replaced. Main difficulty in his work is not having enough instruments to produce better quality of work and unable to achieve certain music effects to fulfill his demanding customers. Difficulties could affect his mind, but he learns to deal with tough situation in the future easily.

Edmond was very happy to receive the Scholarship and Fellowship awards, which are very good support and recognition of his work. They offered financial support and allowed him to equip instruments for his future developments. He is grateful to a professor who suggested him to apply to these awards. His family was very poor when he was a child, his parents could not afford him to learn piano, but he can play a TV drama theme song with a toy piano in a shop without learning it. His uncle and cousin financed his piano study.

He thinks the awards are very encouraging; students got recognition in their ability, and provide opportunities for students to study overseas, boarder perspectives can be developed. Towards the local arts and cultural development, Edmond thinks the government should have more support; for example, Hong Kong still do not have a concert hall that passed performance standard and music education of primary and secondary schools need to cover more on music appreciation, as the students lack knowledge to appreciate other kind of music apart from canton pop songs.

His motto is perseverance and diligence. In his leisure time, he plays ping-pong ball, tennis and reading, mainly on philosophy. ☒☒

Ms Christine LEUNG Chi-mei is currently studying at Baptist University for her doctoral degree. Christine is wholly paralyzed due to a traffic accident in 1989 when she lived in the United Kingdom. Before the accident, she was working in the middle management in a multi-national company, and she worked aggressively to reach the top management. The accident changed her life-what can be, what have been and what will be was not the same. She felt hopeless and isolated herself from the rest of the world after the accident. She did not talk to anyone and avoided meeting people for almost half a year. Eventually she recovered from depression as she realized that her family: her parents, her brothers, her sister and her son were with her during her dark age. She was not alone, and they shared her feelings. She decided that she should live happily for those who care about her.

Christine is a brave and self-driven person. Even though Christine lost her flexibility to move in the accident, it does not stop her from moving forward. During the legal procedure of soliciting her accident compensation, her interest in law was ignited. She decided to study for a law degree. During her study, she was informed that her beloved dad had passed away from sickness. The news brought her back to depression. She was once hospitalized and refused to receive any medication. Once again, she recovered from her brother's support, and acquired the law degree in 1999. Christine reminded us that family is always invaluable to us, and we should treasure their care and love before it is too late.

The story does not end here. Tragically, Christine's mother became paralyzed in a car accident, to make matter worse her mother lost her memory. Christine decided to return to Hong Kong in 1999 in order to spend more time with her family. She was admitted by the Baptist University as a master student in the Arts in Communications, and later as a doctor candidate in the same field.

In addition to studying, Christine is keen on helping the disabled. She is currently a consultant of the Direction Association for the Handicapped. Christine believes that education is especially important to the disabled. She believes that education helps the disabled to play a more important role in the society. She hopes that there will be more scholarship schemes similar to those sponsored by the Sir Edward Youde Memorial Fund for the disabled to encourage and support them to receive education.

At last, Christine would like to thank the Sir Edward Youde Memorial Fund Council for awarding her the fellowship. She was hospitalized in Beijing during her fellowship interview. She was so grateful that the Fund Council was kind enough to arrange her interview via video-conferencing. Without the fellowship, she would have a hard time in paying the expenses on the equipment that is necessary for her study. ☒

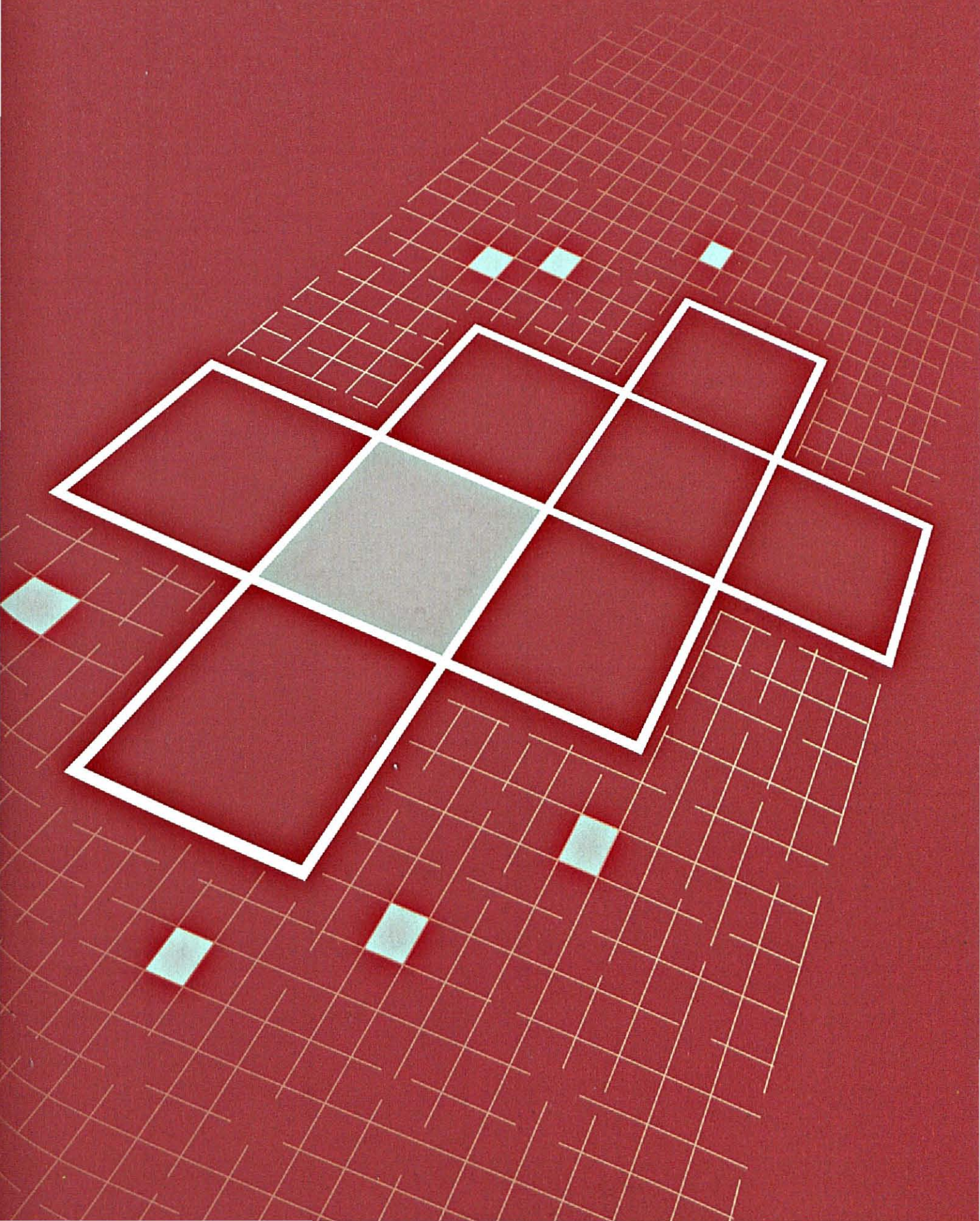

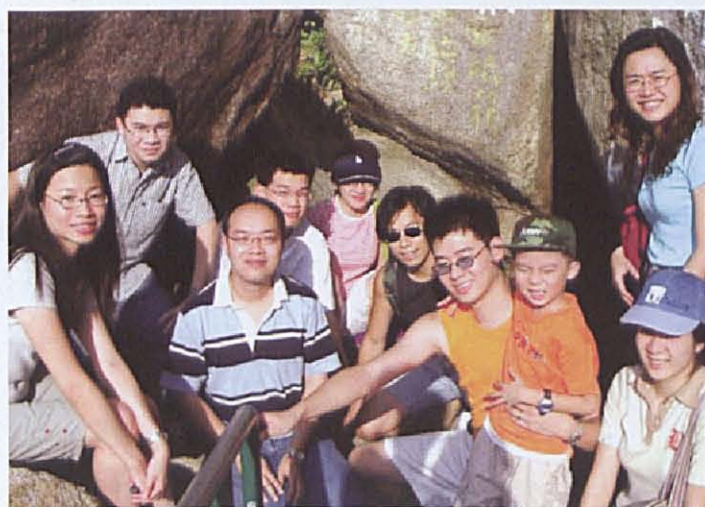

He explains that a strong sense of responsibility, good working attitude, good communication and interpersonal skills are vital and can drive him to work happily. Study Tour

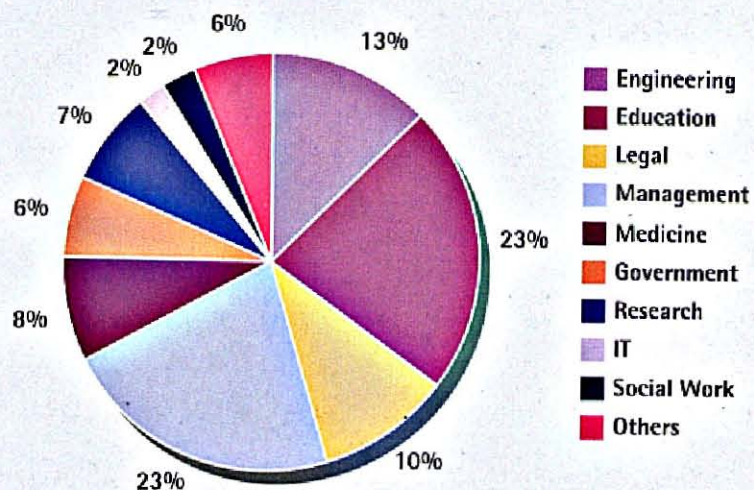

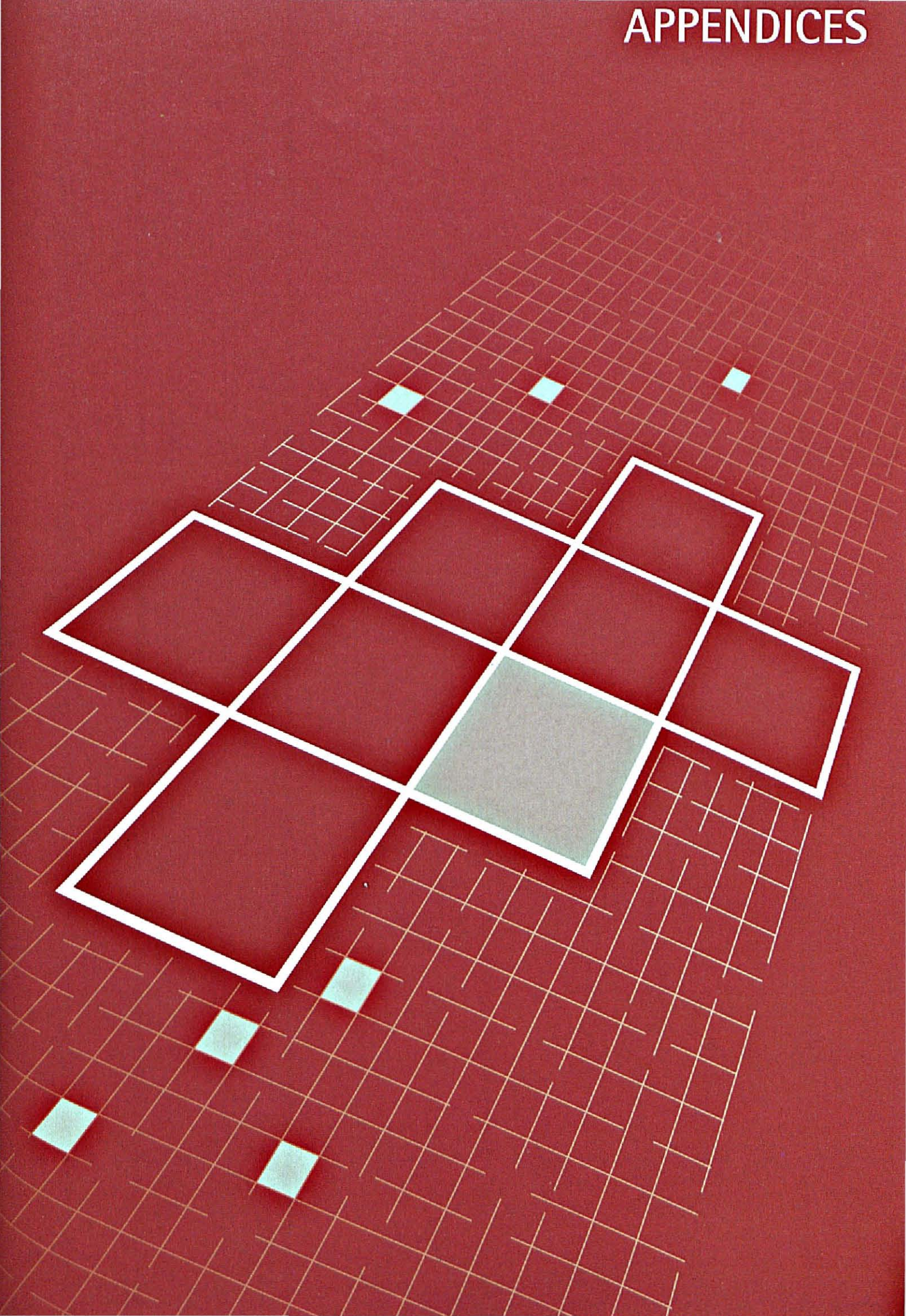

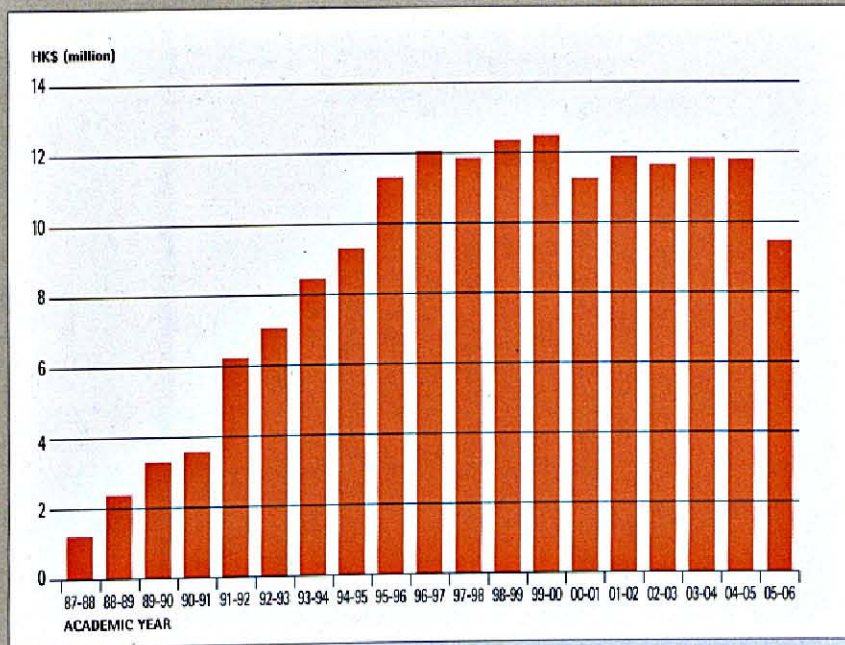

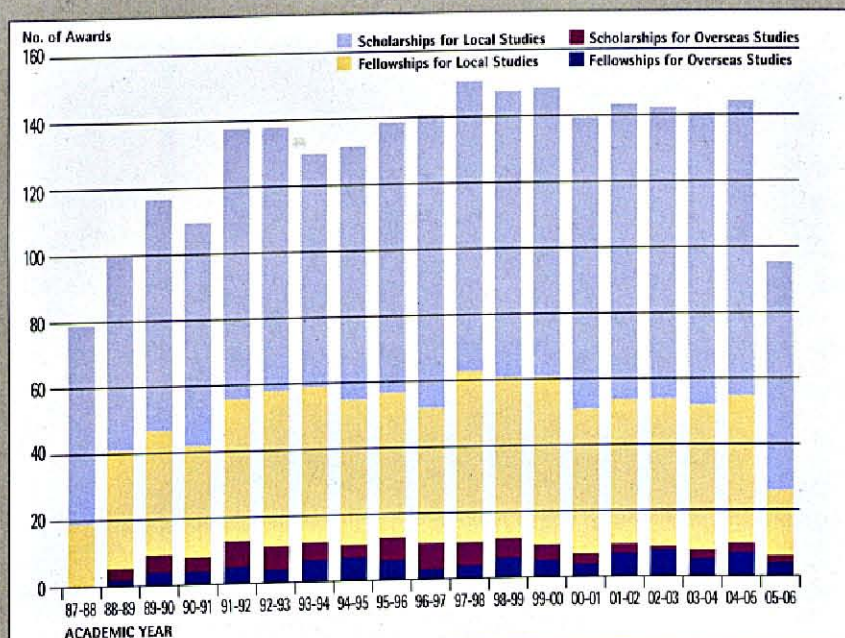

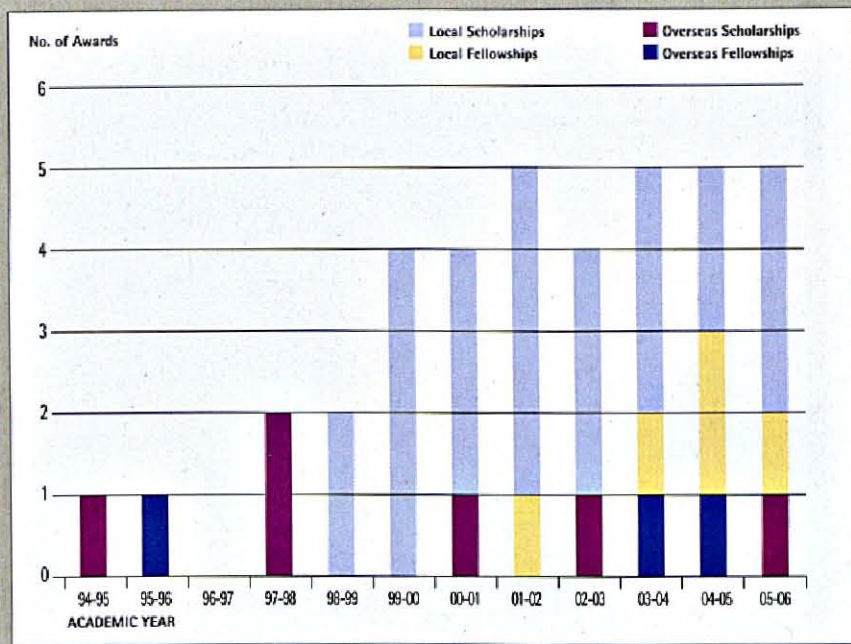
AMOUNT OF FUND DISBURSED



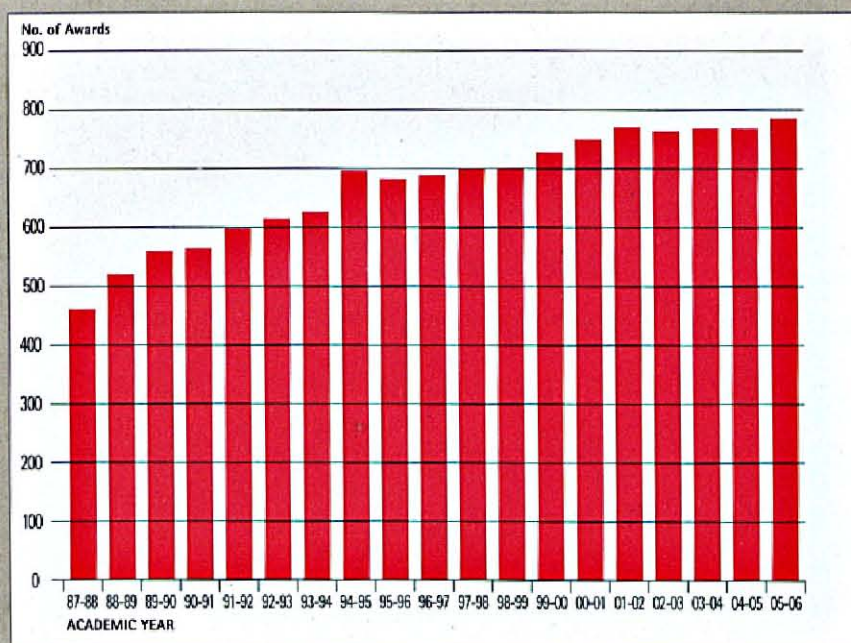

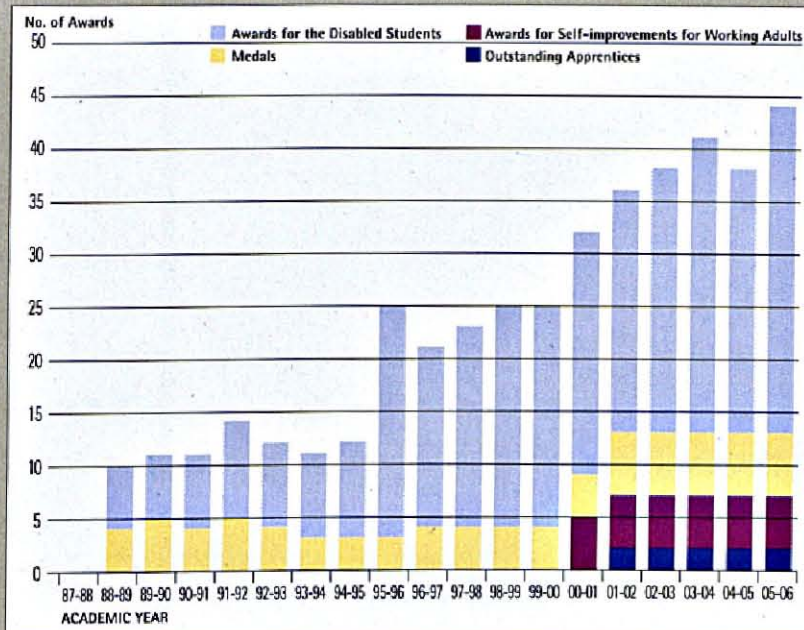
FELLOWSHIPS AND SCHOLARSHIPS FOR DISABLED STUDENTS



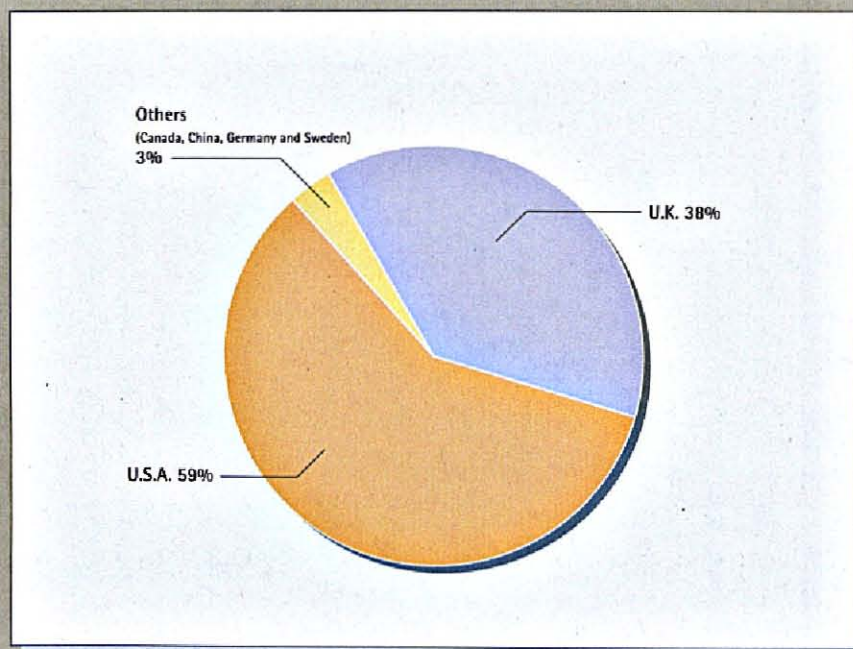

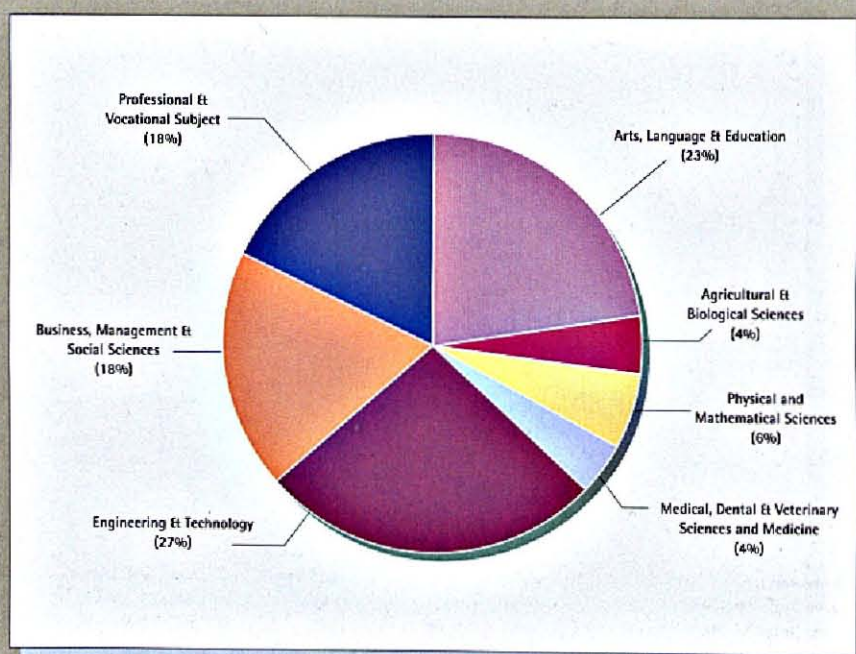

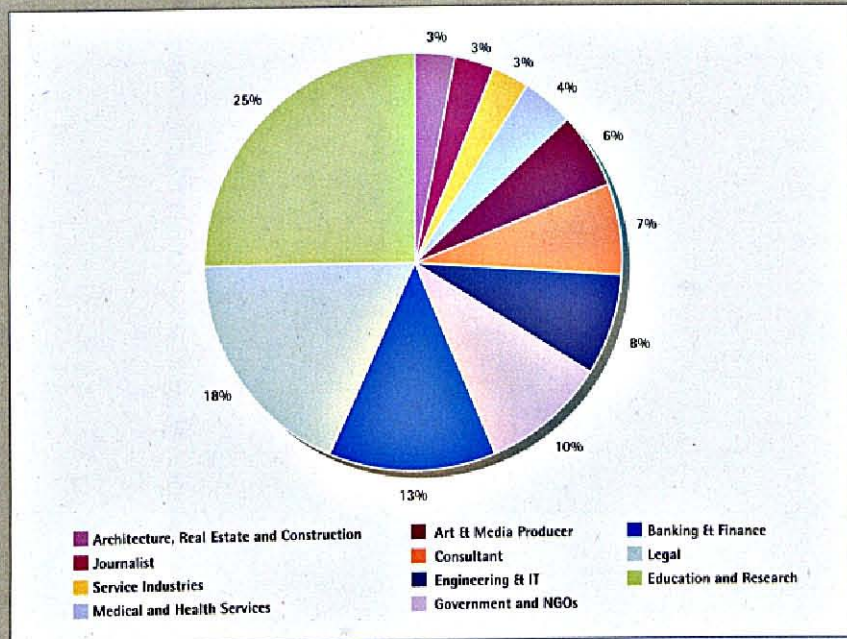
COUNTRY OF STUDIES FOR OVERSEAS FELLOWS AND SCHOLARS (1988-2006)



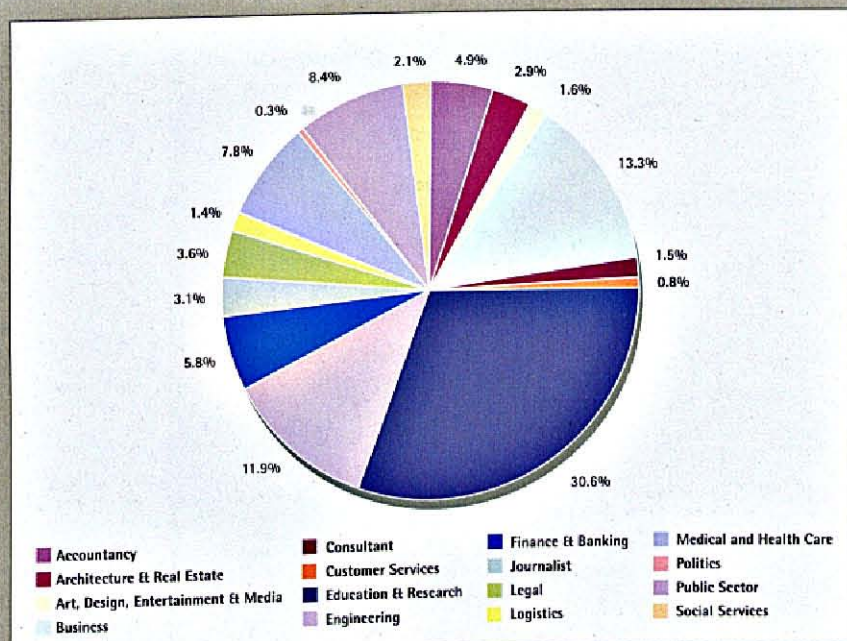
FIELDS OF STUDIES FOR OVERSEAS FELLOWS AND SCHOLARS (1988-2006)



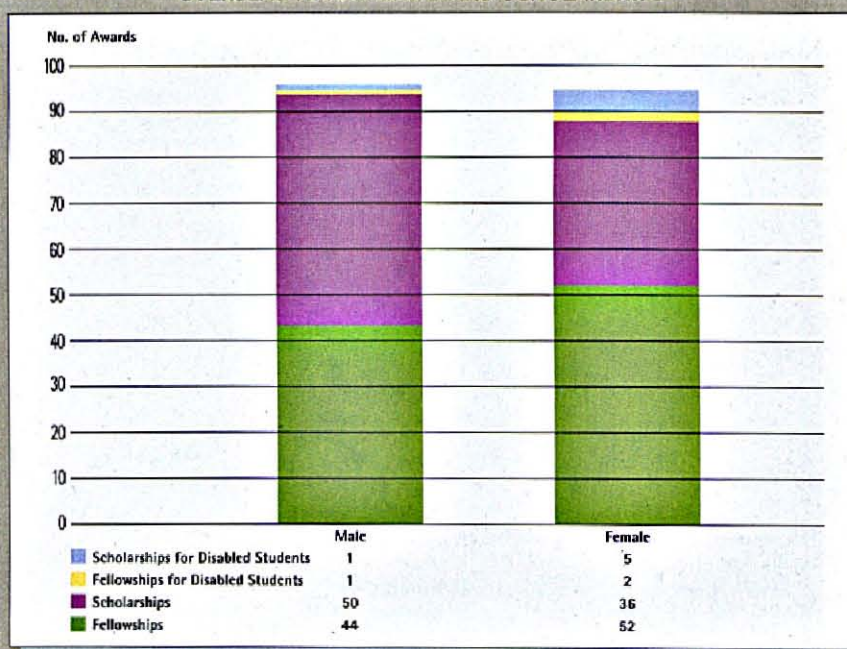
CONTRIBUTION OF THE OVERSEAS FELLOWS AND SCHOLARS TO THE SOCIETY
(STATISTICS AS AT FEBRUARY 2006)



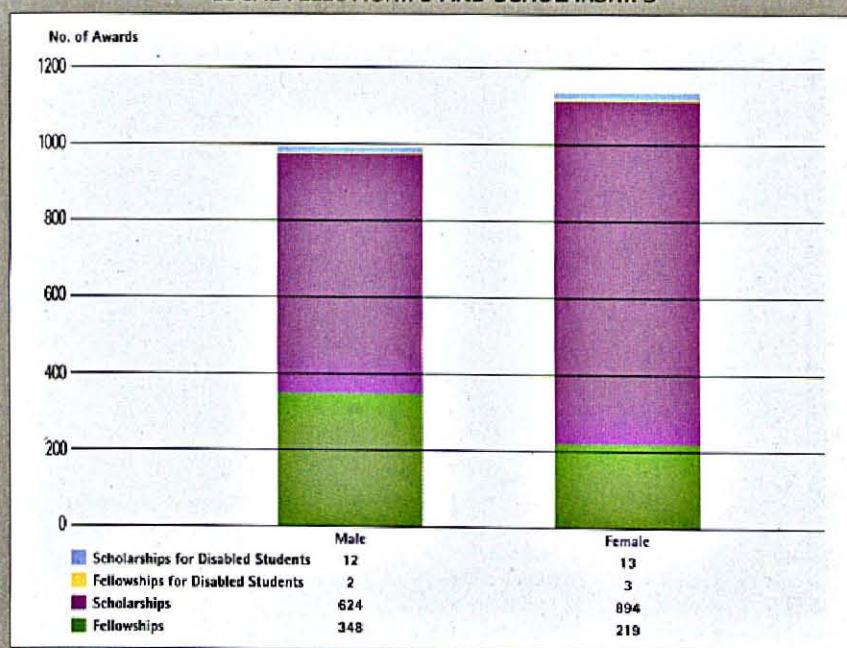
CONTRIBUTION OF THE LOCAL FELLOWS AND SCHOLARS TO THE SOCIETY

MEMBERSHIP OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF SIR EDWARD YAUDE MEMORIAL FUND

The SEYMF was established with a body corporate with perpetual succession under the stipulation of the SEYMF Ordinance, Cap. 1140 of the Laws of Hong Kong. This body is known as the "Board of Trustees of the Sir Edward Youde Memorial Fund", which holds the Fund upon trust to apply the income for the general purpose of providing for and encouraging the education or learning of, or research by, the people of Hong Kong.

The Board of Trustees is responsible for overseeing the financial standing of the Fund and generating income by investing the moneys of the Fund. Currently, the Board of Trustees is serviced by the Trust Funds, Temples and Cemeteries Joint Secretariat under the purview of the Home Affairs Bureau of the HKSARG.

MEMBERSHIP OF SIR EDWARD YAUDE MEMORIAL FUND COUNCIL

Another body, the "Sir Edward Youde Memorial Fund Council" was established to deal with daily operation of the Fund and its spectrum of schemes. It is given the power to determine all matters concerning the application of income of the Fund and the fulfillment of the Fund's purposes. The Student Financial Assistance Agency of the HKSARG acts as the secretariat and provides logistics and miscellaneous support to the operation of the Council.
